"News from the Construction Process and Procurement Scholarship Group"

You might recall the following news item from August - 'Training bid - Full Proposal to EPSRC Masters Level Training Initiative - Training for Performance Improvement in Construction

A bid was made for funding of £155,000 to develop 13 new MSc modules that would lead to new masters programmes in Lean Construction and in Strategic Procurement Management. The simple idea is to shift the emphasis in our current masters programmes more towards process (to sit alongside our current Construction IT/management modules).

The modules themselves will be process/IT flavoured and will be developed with industry around our research portfolio - hence we are emphasising to EPSRC that they are industry lead

but research driven. The good news is that EPSRC have agreed to fund the bid!! This was the only successful construction bid in the UK. This is a great opportunity for us to develop our masters programmes; it enables us to meet our objectives of having research driving the teaching at this level. That the bid succeeded in competition with Universities and disciplines from across the engineering and science base, is a great credit to the University and the industrial sponsors. A sign of being a world leader in scholarship in our discipline perhaps. These courses will also complement the development of the proposed Centre for Construction Innovation (see last weeks newsletter).

Bids Submitted

A Research bid for 98K has been submitted to the BT Higher Education Awards to develop a national web-based PhD clinic. Further details of the outcome to follow.

Three further bids have been submitted this week. The first is an EPSRC bid for £200,000 under LINK IDAC. The proposal is titled 'Re-engineering lean frame processes using advanced technologies.
