Disaster Risk Reduction

In May 2015, the UN General Assembly endorsed the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (2015-2030), which was adopted by UN Member States in March 2015. The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction charts the global course over the next 15 years. It recognises that the State has the primary role to reduce disaster risk, but that responsibility should be shared with other stakeholders including local government, the private sector and other stakeholders. It urges to better understand disaster risk, strengthen disaster risk governance, invest in disaster risk reduction and enhance disaster response to 'Build Back Better'. Its implementation compels the channeling of expertise from multiple disciplines for informed decision making and innovative policy formulation. During the consultations and negotiations that led to the finalisation of the Sendai framework, strong calls were made to develop practical, evidence-based guidance to support implementation, ensure engagement and ownership of action by all stakeholders, and strengthen accountability in disaster risk reduction.

Reducing disaster risk is an issue cutting across different sectors, which requires trans-disciplinary and transboundary approaches with the support of the natural and social sciences, including for natural hazards and applied fields such as health, agriculture, economics, environment, engineering and technology. This necessitates a professional approach to their management as relevant competencies have to be developed continuously.

In Sri Lanka, recognition of disaster risk reduction (DRR) as a core competency of professional disciplines is yet to be achieved. This is also the ground reality in South Asia. Realizing this, the SAARC Disaster Management Centre has initiated a process to bring together multiа disciplinary team of professionals to serve its member countries to provide policy advice and facilitate capacity building including strategic services learning, research, training, system development, expertise promotion and exchange of information for effective disaster risk reduction. Such expertise available is scattered in silos of professional disciplines and not utilized in the current realm of DRR in the country.

The commencement of the Association of Disaster Risk Management Professionals of Sri Lanka (ADRiMP) aspires to address this need. ADRIMP is an assembly of professionals representing varied disciplines to nurture a culture of safety in Sri Lanka from the impact of disasters and provides a platform for dialogue to achieve effective implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (2015-2030) and the Paris Agreement (2015 -2030) for combating climate change and advocacy for policy initiatives and related matters thereof.

Objectives of ADRiMP

- The providing of a Forum for discussion of matters of professional interest and for consideration of all matters related to disaster and climate risk management in the country by recognizing and maintaining standards and ethics of disaster risk management professionals.
- The fostering of the participation by the disaster risk management professionals in matters of national and regional interest for disaster and climate risk management and promoting such interest by co-operation with both Governmental and non- Governmental Organizations.
- To serve as a knowledge hub for promoting research in disaster and climate risk management.
- To serve as a think-tank and an advisory body for the promotion of a culture of safety and integration of national endeavors with regional and global initiatives.
- The provision of such facilities and services that are conducive to furthering of the objectives of the Association

Membership, constitution and registration as a legal entity

During this period, screening of membership applications has been concluded and currently, Association the has 160 registered members. The draft constitution has been finalized for ratification at the first AGM. The Association is now а registered legal entity.

Achievements of ADRiMP to Date

- August 2018 saw us launch the Association with His Excellency the President of Sri Lanka as the Chief Guest at the BMICH on 23rd August.
- January 2019 Conducted a half-day session on Localization of Sendai SFDRR indicators in Sri Lanka on 17th January 2019 as part of the International Ascent Festival for Capacity building for research innovation and in Disaster resilience organized by University of Huddersfield, U.K. University of Moratuwa and University of Colombo and partners, 14-18th January at Cinnamon Lakeside, Colombo.
- June 2019 In collaboration with the Climate
- Change Secretariat and with the support of World Vision Lanka, conducted Awareness on Climate Change, Impacts, and Climate Change Adaptation to mark the World Environment Day 2019 on 18th June.
- July 2019 A web portal was hosted for the Association which is currently being updated www.adrimp.org.lk

Thereafter, it had been an uphill task with limited financial resources and without full-time personnel to attend to demanding tasks of a newborn. Interim Committee members provided inputs as and when time allowed them, and we are happy that ADRiMP has been able to achieve several important milestones. We thank all members who have supported these initiatives. Unfortunately, the visibility of this work has remained low due to the lack of media exposure regular communication with and the membership.

- Conduct a web-based Workshop on Research Paper Writing in January with international collaboration
- Serve as a Key Partner in the International Symposium on Multi-Hazard Early Warning and Disaster Risk Reduction which will be held on 19th to 20th March in Colombo.
- ADRiMP has agreed to be a partner with IUCN for the ECO - DRR initiative in Sri Lanka.
